

ORDINANCE NUMBER 455  
(FIRST PUBLISHED IN THE PRAIRIE STAR JULY 28, 2010)

AN ORDINANCE ATTESTING TO AN INCREASE IN TAX REVENUES FOR  
BUDGET YEAR  
2011 FOR THE CITY OF MOLINE.

WHEREAS, the City of Moline must continue to provide services to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of this community; and

WHEREAS, the cost of providing essential services to the citizens of this city continues to increase; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Legislature has cut growth in demand transfers to local governments below what is required by state statute; and

WHEREAS, the 2000 Kansas Legislature significantly reduced demand transfer payments to local governments below last year's levels;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Governing Body of the City of Moline:

**Section One.** In accordance with state law, the City of Moline has conducted a public hearing and has published the proposed budget necessary to fund city services from January 1, 2011 until December 31, 2011.

**Section Two.** After careful public deliberations, the governing body has determined that in order to maintain the public services which are essential for the citizens of this city, it will be necessary to budget property tax revenues in an amount which exceeds the 2010 budget.

**Section Three.** This ordinance shall take effect after publication once in the official city newspaper.
